

¹ A combination of state and \$50 million federal Race to The Top (RTTT) grant for early education increases spending an additional \$70 million 2010-2015 which does not include a Dell Foundation \$1.5 million to expand the K-12 Insight Dashboard to early childhood education, to provide teachers and administrators access information on how students are performing in the classroom from birth through pre-kindergarten. The current plan does not include information for parents.
